

Update on FA2-1: Review and develop targeted programs to support studies and placements for specified groups of potential educators and teachers











FA2-1

- Review and develop targeted programs to support studies and placements for specified groups of potential educators and teachers.
 - » The two initial specified groups are Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, and those from regional and remote communities.
- Short-term action that sits under the 'attraction and retention' focus area.
- Seeks to embed workforce diversity, including attracting the right people into the sector and valuing and retaining high calibre staff.
- Recognises that targeted programs and strategies are required to overcome barriers to entry into the sector for certain groups.
- The project will inform advice to governments and the sector on innovative and effective approaches to supporting studies and placements.

Action	Timescale	Summary of consultation survey results
FA2-1 Review and develop targeted programs to support studies and placements for specified groups of potential educators and teachers	Short (within three years)	83% of respondents strongly support (36%) or support (47%) [n=2,689]

Rationale

- Workforce diversity is important, both to raise the professional profile of the sector and to deliver quality outcomes for all children
- Targeted strategies are required to overcome barriers to entry for certain groups of prospective educators and teachers (e.g. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander educators, and regional and remote communities)
- Children's education and care service providers can find navigating various government workforce related initiatives, incentives and opportunities challenging. This can impact the effectiveness of initiatives where they are most needed

What's happened so far?

- Two suppliers are on board to deliver the project:
 - » SNAICC National Voice for our Children to undertake consultation with First Nations people and review targeted programs for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.
 - Scyne Advisory Pty Ltd to undertake consultation with people from regional and remote communities and review targeted programs aimed at these groups.
- An initial desktop scan and analysis of existing targeted programs was developed and delivered in May 2023, highlighting 31 targeted programs that support ECEC workforce attraction and retention.
- A complementary approach to stakeholder consultation has been developed for the two suppliers.











What's next?

- SNAICC and Scyne Advisory will undertake consultation with identified stakeholders between now and end of February 2024.
- Delivery of consultation summary reports.
- Development of best practice case studies, identifying the core features and success factors of effective approaches.
- Delivery of final reports for the two streams.
- Distillation of findings to inform future policy design.
